The purpose of this letter is to inform you about and encourage you to attend the 45th MACA Annual Conference on February 6th and 7th at the Bost Center on the MSU campus. The program planning committee put together what we hope to be an informative and entertaining program this year. We have the usual suspects with MSU Extension as some of the headliners. Trust me when I say, I do not mean that in any way as a slight to them but as an appreciation for their numerous and continuous years of being on the program. Their dedication and hard work helps to make our job easier.
